RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT

The City issued a total of zero (0) permits for single-family residential construction within the month of May.

The City issued a total of **five (5)** permits for <u>two-family (duplex) residential</u> construction within the month of May.

To date in calendar year 2024 (January 1, 2024 - December 31, 2024) the City has issued a total of twentytwo (22) residential permits: twelve (12) single-family permits, ten (10) two-family permits, and zero (0) multi-family permits.

POPULATION ESTIMATES

As of May 31, 2024, the estimated population for the City of Harker Heights is <u>35,610</u> residents. According to the US Census, the population as of April 1, 2020, was 33,097 residents. Since that time, we have added 846 new water accounts with an average household size of 2.97.
