


Art with Miss Heather Wednesdays June 25 | July 9 and 23 | 6:00 p.m.


Registration is open for youth basketball camps. The camps will be held at the Recreation Center July 7-9, and July 14-16.

# **AQUATICS**

- Carl Levin Park Pool hours for open swim have been adjusted for the 4th of July holiday. The hours are Friday, July 4 – Sunday, July 6, 2025, from 10:00 am – 6:00 pm each day.
- Pool Season 2025 Passes are on sale in person only at the Harker Heights Recreation Center. The options are individual pass (Res. \$50 /Non-Res. \$70), family pass (Res. \$70 /Non-Res. \$135), or senior (50+) pass (Res. \$25 / Non-Res. \$35).
- Learn-to-Swim lessons registration is open, register children ages 6 months - 15 yrs. old online or in person at the Recreation Center. The fee is Res. \$50 and Non-Res. \$60. All classes meet Tuesday – Friday for two weeks.
- The pool season is currently open through August 2025. The hours for the 2025 Open Swim are Tuesday – Friday from 1 pm – 7 pm and Saturday & Sunday from 10 am – 6 pm. Daily entry fee at the gate is cash only and based on age and resident or non-resident status.
