


The Stewart C. Meyer Harker Heights Public Library





COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT

To date in calendar year 2024 (January 1, 2024 - December 31, 2024) the City has issued a total of forty-two (42) residential permits: twenty-seven (27) single-family permits, fifteen (15) two-family permits, and zero (0) multifamily permits.

POPULATION ESTIMATES

As of August 31, 2024, the estimated population for the City of Harker Heights is <u>35,820</u> residents. According to the US Census, the population as of April 1, 2020, was 33,097 residents. Since that time, we have added 917 new water accounts with an average household size of 2.97.
