

Boil Water Notice Rescinded
February 27, 2021

TCEQ Required Notice:

On February 19, 2021, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality required the City of Harker Heights public water system, 0140023, to issue a Boil Water Notice to inform customers, individuals, or employees that due to conditions which occurred recently in the public water system, the water from this public water system was required to be boiled prior to use for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

The public water system has taken the necessary corrective actions to restore the quality of the water distributed by this public water system used for drinking water or human consumption purposes and has provided TCEQ with laboratory test results that indicate that the water no longer requires boiling prior to use as of February 27, 2021.

February 27, 2021 Boil Water Order Lifted for All Harker Heights Properties:

Normal water usage may resume immediately.

A boil water notice issued February 19 for all properties in Harker Heights is lifted effective immediately. This includes all Harker Heights schools and all other properties in the city.

A water shortage caused by extreme winter weather reduced water pressure and services, which necessitated the city-wide boil order.

Service has been restored, and all water quality tests have been completed. The water is now safe to drink and use without boiling.
