Adopt-A-Spot Program

The City of Harker Heights Parks and Recreation

Department encourages families, neighborhoods, community or civic groups, businesses, youth groups, schools, and individuals to get involved in the beautification of the community. Eligible Sites

The City of Harker Heights will provide a list of eligible spots for adoption. We welcome suggestions that may not currently be included on the list. Assignments will be made on a first-come basis.

How it Works

Once a spot has been assigned, the adopting group will commit to help maintain the adopted spot for a minimum of two years. Within those two years, the group will perform maintenance a minimum of twice per adopted year, including the city's annual cleanup day held in the spring. Maintenance will include but is not limited to litter pick up and debris removal. The adopting organization/individual agrees to inform the Outdoor Programs Coordinator of clean updates and times and supply needs at least one week prior to scheduled cleanup.

Reporting

At the conclusion of each clean-up, the group will provide a report to the Outdoor Programs Coordinator kgomez@harkerheights.gov documenting your efforts. Additionally, all groups are asked to submit an inspection report no later than one week after each clean up. Forms may be obtained from the Outdoor Programs Coordinator or online at www.harkerheights.gov/parks

General Guideline

- Obey and abide by laws and regulations related to safety as required by city ordinance or state law.
- Provide adult supervision for volunteers 15 years and younger
- The possession or consumption of alcohol is prohibited.
- Weare safety gear and equipment as appropriate.

Trash Removal

The Harker Heights Parks and Recreation Department will provide trash bags to groups upon request. All trash must be placed in bags. Objects too large/heavy shall be placed next to the bags. Full bags are to be placed in park dumpsters or by adopt a spot sign for pickup by parks and recreation staff.

Termination of Agreement

The Harker Heights Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to terminate an agreement at any time if the adopting organization does not meet the terms and conditions of the agreement or does not participate in the city's annual cleanup day. Groups wanting to terminate their agreement with the city must provide 30 days' notice.

Renewal

Renewal of agreements and continuation in the Adopt A Spot program will be subject to approval by the Parks and Recreation Department



Release

The adopting organization/individual shall release, relieve, hold harmless, and indemnify the City, its agents, servants, and employees for all actions, claims, injuries, lawsuits arising out of or in any way connected to the activities of the Adopt A Spot program.
